The Dynamic Duo!

Harley and Sebastion came from Riverside County in California were they were part of 26 cockers seized from an animal hoarder. The situation they were confiscated from was horrific, living in filth, severely matted, malnourished and extremely underweight. Both boys weighing a mere 15lbs each with their ideal weight being around 24lbs. It took 4 baths just to get them clean enough to be able to shave them down to remove the mounds of dirty, matted hair that was covered with their own feces and urine. They both had to undergo cherry eye surgery (a common easily fixed prolapsed gland of the third eyelid) and be altered. They were frightened and un-socialized. When they first arrived they would cower and urinate if you tried to touch

them. Harley would scream in fear and try to flee. His little heart would pound so fast and he would salivate from the anxiety. We started their rehabilitation process by taking them on "pack" walks with about 20 people and their dogs. At first, no one attempted to interact with the scared siblings to give them time to learn to be able to trust. humans again. Now the dog walker's comment what different dogs they are today and how far they have come. It's amazing what a little love and patience can do and how their little spirits remained loving and hopeful after everything they have been through. Only a dog can be this forgiving and willing to give humans another chance. Today the boys are happy little wigglebutts with a lot of love

to give. Now when we pick them up they just melt into our arms and snuggle closer. We



would love to keep them together as they are a bonded pair and are good company for one another that it would be rather a shame to separate them but we won't let that stop them from getting a loving home of their own. Meet Rusty! The gorgeous 2 year old chocolate and white parti colored cocker. The sweet, shy boy that quickly warms up once he gets to know you. Rusty was taken in by some caring people off the streets of Los Angeles who are not able to keep him but are determined to keep him out of the shelter system. They sent a plea out to the local cocker rescue groups in the area who unfortunately were not able to take him in as they were

already overwhelmed and over capacity. Although we too currently have no available room we did not want to see this beautiful boy end up in the shelter so we agreed to take him even though we have no alternative but to put him in boarding. Rusty is temporarily residing in a boarding facility in Los Angeles. Once he arrives here he will have to undergo surgery to fix his cherry eye (a common, easily fixed prolapsed gland of the

third eyelid) and will be neutered at the same time. Once he has recovered he will be available for adoption. We currently need sponsors for Rusty to help us with both his boarding expenses and surgery costs. Thank you for supporting animal rescue!

Foster Homes Desperately Needed!

Fostering is an essential part of animal rescue. Sadly, often we have to turn dogs away due to lack of resources and space. The shelters have far too many animals and don't have the time or take the initiative to provide proper and humane care of the dogs coming into the shelter. The primary role of a foster home is to get to

know the individual dog's personality and needs so we can match it up to the "right home." In addition the foster home may need to help with socialization, obedience training, crate training and/or housetraining. If willing, possibly caring for a cocker if they are recovering from a medical issue. Above all a

foster home provides a temporary warm, safe, loving and nurturing environment just as if it was there own dog. Angels Under Our Wings pays for all approved veterinary care. A foster home literally enables us to save a dog's life as well as plays a valuable role in their adoption. Now that's a rewarding experience!

So he was brought up from Los Angeles with his house mate Priscilla (who has been adopted to a wonderful home here in Victoria and her new name is

Sophie). After a vet visit and learning the obvious that he was very underweight it was discovered that Scooby had a lack of muscle tone and his knees kept dislocating. We feel he probably was caged a lot in his short young life. The vet advised no running so we looked for an alternative form of exercise that would be easy on his knees but would build muscle tone and the first thing that came to mind was aqua therapy. We contacted Cory

from K9 Fit Fur Fun to book some sessions and were excited to get started. Scooby of course was apprehensive but Cory was amazingly patient and gently and Scooby was a very brave boy and did awesome his first time in the pool! We are looking forward to watching his progress.

Whew! Does it ever slow down? Sadly we have come to realize that as long as there are backyard breeders, puppy-mills and people not altering their pets the answer to that is no. We have a number of dogs arriving soon once we have available space. We are currently working on 5 dogs in Saskatchewan (Beauty, Dusty, Twinkle, Sugar and Java) that are being given up by a breeder who is moving and has decided to give up breeding. We have limited information of the dogs at this point but we are anxious to get them here as we understand they are currently

living outdoors. For the time being they are not in danger of being euthanized. Rusty will also be coming up from Los Angeles once we have room but for now he is safe in boarding. Gracie is currently in a foster home in Prince George but can be brought to Victoria for a pre-approved adopter. Ginger is available in the Toronto area if you know of anyone looking for a cocker. We are also able to bring in most of the cockers listed on our rescue partner's website www.campcocker.com for a pre-approved adopter only. Every day we also see a

number of cockers in the shelters we would love to offer a second chance to, however, with limited resources and space we can't do it without your help. If you are able to offer a foster home or sponsor a dog by donating toward their boarding expenses as a temporary solution to get them to safety until an available space opens up, that is one more life we can save.
